### Getting Around

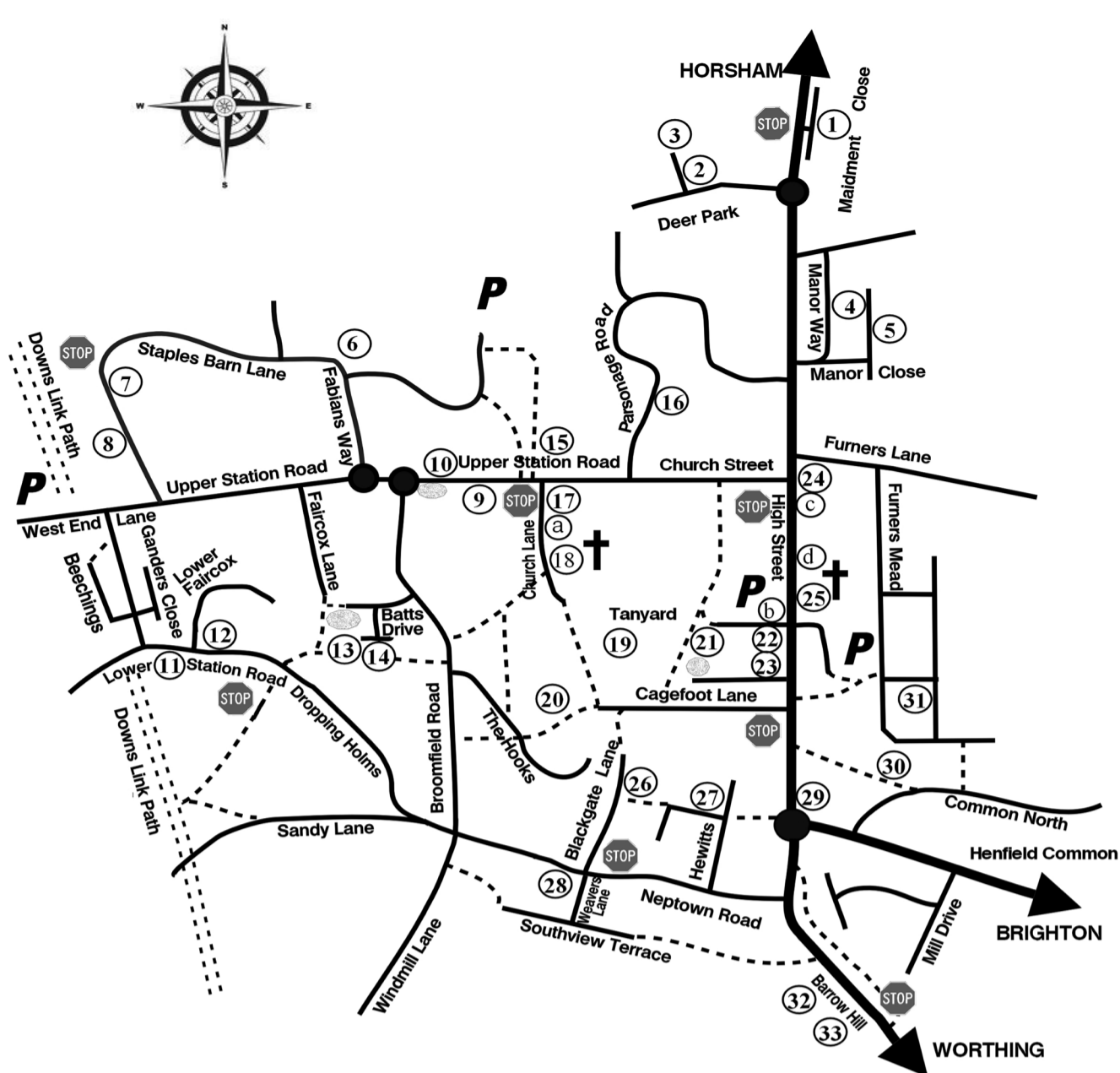
Please walk or cycle around the trail as parking in the village is limited. Please use the car parks indicated on the adjacent map, or...

Catch the free **Henfield Community Minibus** which follows a circular route around the village, approximately every 30mins between 11am-4pm.

Either hail the bus to be picked up, use one of the dedicated stops marked on the map, or use the 'Dial-a-ride' service by booking on: 07891 044886 to be collected/taken home. The minibus has full wheelchair access.

### Guide to symbols



#### 1 ■ Maidment Court, Wantley Hill

Maidment Court-on-Sea - an Edwardian day at the seaside in miniature by the Henfield Dolls House Projects Club (Wheelchair access by ramps). WC.

#### 2 ■ 5 St Peter's View

Small, newly created garden on modern estate. Something of everything done on a smaller scale. Lawn, pond, patio, sunroom greenhouse. WC.

#### 3 ■ 8 St Peter's View

A small labour-saving garden designed for the older person with borders and multiple pot-planting. Demonstrations of wood carving given at various times on a 2/3 life-size carousel horse.

#### 4 ■ 6 Manor Way

Wild flower front garden designed around a cherry tree. Family-friendly back garden with salad patch, climbers and rambling borders. Exhibiting local photography, woodturning and canvas art. Homemade cakes for sale.

#### 5 ■ 22 Manor Close

Come and meet our chickens Henrietta, Margot and Jemima. See the ponds, veg plot, fruit trees, flower beds and visit the children's play area.

#### 6 ■ St Peter's School, Fabians Way

Exhibition of children's artwork and a chance to view the school, outdoor classroom and environmental area. Ice cream and Pimms on sale. Music sessions by pupils. WC.

#### 7 ■ Temata, 6 Staples Barn

Selection of art from local artists including painting and crafts. Tea, coffee and light snacks.

#### 8 ■ Staples, Staples Barn Lane

Long garden, fruit trees, an Indian Bean tree and flower borders. Pond with Acers.

#### 9 ■ Avorlind, Upper Station Road

Gardens front and back offering variety and colour, small vegetable plot, easily managed by older couple.

#### 10 ■ The Finches, Upper Station Road

Developing garden, borders, large patio area with pots. Enclosed vegetable area with raised beds. Interest for children. Tea, coffee and cakes. Wheelchair access.

#### 11 ■ Three Oaks, Lower Station Road

Mature garden with a mixture of herbaceous borders and shrubs. WC.

#### 12 ■ Greensleeves, Lower Station Road

Typical English country garden with flower, fruit and vegetables. Dogs welcome on leads. There will be a programme of poetry readings during the day. Craft and book stall. WC. **Saturday only**

#### 13 ■ 7 Batts Drive

An interesting rock garden with a variety of plants from alpines to azaleas. Two small ponds with a waterfall and steep steps. Partial wheelchair access.

#### 14 ■ 6 Batts Drive

An individual approach to a sandy slope with an unusual layout and pond. In its third year of cultivation. **Saturday only**

#### 15 ■ Sobell Court, Church Street

Flowerbeds, borders, bushes, perennials and annuals. Pleasant surroundings to enjoy our fabulous homemade cakes with your tea and coffee. Cards and craft items. Partial wheelchair access. WC. No parking.

#### 16 ■ 110 Parsonage Road

A garden that is a work in progress on a theme of blue and orange, comprising mature shrubs interspersed with new planting. Gourmet BBQ lunches. WC.

#### 17 ■ Hacketts Cottage, Church Lane

Garden with church views and landscaped rear garden with maturing borders. Relax with a Ploughmans lunch or quiche & salad. Exhibition by local artist. WC.

#### 18 ■ St Peter's Church

Recently reordered to reflect its vibrant spiritual life and work within the community which it has served for almost 1,250 years. Enjoy the artwork, listen to the music and absorb the atmosphere. WC.

#### 19 ■ The Tanyard, Cagefoot Lane

Wildflower meadow opens once again. Stroll, picnic, or just sit and enjoy a local ice cream from the stall.

#### 20 ■ Red Oaks, The Hooks

Children's play area. Hot and cold food and drinks. Variety of artwork on display, Tottington Woodlanders on Saturday. Disabled access and WC.

#### 21 ■ The Scout Hut, Tanyard

Art, craft and cards on display and for sale by members of Henfield Art Club. Demonstrations by members on both days. Membership enquiries welcome from all abilities. WC.

#### 22 ■ Henfield Dental Surgery, High Street

Local artists displaying their work on the walls of the reception area. WC.

#### 23 ■ Thorndene, High Street

Secret walled garden with ammonite path. Veggies in tin baths. Locally made 'Green Men', decorative plaques, garden ornaments and roof finials for sale. Also gardenalia including cards, cartwheels and chimney pots.

#### 24 ■ 3 Old Dairy Cottages, High Street

Exhibition of vibrant, original watercolours, prints and gift cards. Unique textiles, bags and organic babywear too.

#### 25 ■ Evangelical Free Church, High Street

Rest a while, listen to the music and enjoy the exhibition by Henfield Camera Club. (music on Sat only). Disabled access and WC.

#### 26 ■ Westlea, Blackgate Lane

Through the blue gate into small, densely-planted garden where an expert willow-weaver will demonstrate her craft and display fascinating garden structures. Enjoy tea and homemade cakes while you watch. No parking.

#### 27 ■ Nightingales, 7 Hewitts

Enjoy delicious buttered scones in a quiet garden with secluded seating areas. Fabric puppet theatres, playhouses, nursery/children's room accessories for sale or made to order.

#### 28 ■ Laurel Cottage, Nep Town Road

#### 29 ■ The Golden Hen, Golden Square

A cottage garden with pinks, roses, honeysuckle, foxgloves and more. Plants for sale and Children's Society re-make cards.

#### 30 ■ Malthouse Cottage, The Common North

Small cottage garden that welcomes pets, children and wildlife. Jewellery on display and for sale. **Saturday only**

#### 31 ■ 58 Furners Mead

Pictures from many countries in oil, watercolour, pastel and ink. Also, unusual decoupage greeting cards.

#### 32 ■ Burny Bank, Barrow Hill

A mature 1/4 acre garden of flowers, fruit and vegetables with glorious views to the South Downs. Chickens in the wooded area. WC.

#### 33 ■ Fircroft, Barrow Hill

Professionally designed family garden exhibiting large-scale sculptures from Surrey Sculpture Society. Naturalistic low-maintenance planting and structured hard landscaping offering views of South Downs.
